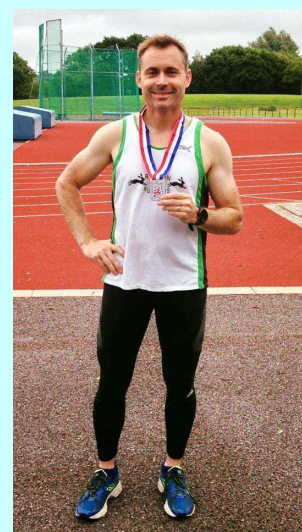

## London Marathon 2016

**Sophie Wilkinson, who was the winner of the ballot for the EVAC (as it was then) place, sent in this report on her day out :**

I finished in 3:40:48 which I was really pleased with as I was aiming for under the Good For Age time for my age (3:50). I stuck with the 8min 35sec pacers for the first half, apart from a quick loo stop at 3 miles, then overtook them just past Tower Bridge so I knew I was going to be sub 3:45. My pacing worked well as the last three miles were the quickest of the race at around 7min 20secs. In retrospect I like to think I could have gone faster but I'm not sure I'd have agreed with that during the race!

I found the congestion the most challenging aspect as it was impossible to keep a line and in the last few miles people were stopping and walking dead in front of me, so it meant a lot of diversions.



I was injured for much of Jan and Feb so my training didn't really start until the last week in Feb. I had, and still have, an upper hamstring problem.

I'm really grateful for the EMAC entry - I'd never have got to have this experience otherwise and it was one of the most rewarding things I've ever done. I'm also grateful to all those who donated to help raise £800 for WWF and Mind.

I've entered for next year and hoping for a few mins off my time, but who knows?

As far as I can tell, five EMAC members took part in the Moulton 5m Race Walk on Saturday 4 June 2016 in a field of 47 participants. It was great walking weather with a very slight breeze and hazy sunshine in a bit of very pleasant, slightly rolling countryside, just a few miles East of Newmarket. This was my very first race walk and it proved to be a good, friendly introduction to the sport.

Personally I started off very steadily then, once I was over a third of the way round, gradually picked up the pace having been warned by doom-mongers that I would suffer all sorts of injuries and afflictions if I even took part. Given that I ran my fastest 10k for about four years the day after, I'm now not convinced that race walking and road running are that incompatible. I would say that it was an enjoyable experience and I am keen to take part again, in a low key event.

The women managed 3rd place, the men 5th, giving a combined outcome of 4th, which was impressive considering EMAC had no M70 athletes, just one W70, and smattering of 60+. Only three out of a possible seven relay teams could be mustered.

Thanks are due to Team Managers Tanya Daniels, Andrew Stowe, and Richard Phelan for doing their utmost to recruit participants before the day, and to Monica Brown, Tessa Stephenson, and Carole Filer for being hands on at the match when Tanya was unable to attend.

There were some significant absences from the teams due to people being committed elsewhere, but all the TMs did comment that their task would be far less onerous if people would just keep in touch, respond to emails and phone calls, and generally help out a bit more before the day.

It seems mean to single out any individual performances from such a day - results are available on the BMAF website and Power of 10 — but one cannot help but notice that in addition to winning the W60 200m, 400m and High Jump, and placing 2nd in the Long Jump, Carole Filer once again bit the bullet and put herself to the sword of the 1500m to gain the team points.

Thanks to all the teams for representing EMAC so well. And if you weren't there and could have been, as Delia once said, "Let's be having you!" for future representative events.

## Obituaries

Since the last eMag was published we have learned of the deaths of Alasdair Ross (not EMAC but a well known, hard-working, and popular athlete, aged 63, from pancreatic cancer), Barry Wallman (long-serving administrator and official with Cambridge County AA, aged 74), Peter Dancer, and David Blyth, ex-RAF and prolific participant, aged 96.

There follow two tributes to David :

### **DAVID BLYTH - IN MEMORIAM**

Kindly submitted by Dave Ainsworth, ex- RAF and Editor of "Essex Walker" newsletter.

I attended Dave Blyth's Memorial Service in Cambridge today , following a brief cremation service. The Service was well attended, with some old RAF types present. An Order of Service had pictures of him with an Argyll & Sutherland Highlanders cap on, and another running in his RAF Coltishall days - as always with handkerchief wound around his left hand.

He was illegitimate and christened **McPail Davidson Barker Blyth**. Later in life, when he realised he'd no wish to have such names, he had himself re-christened as **David Blyth**. His parents went their ways soon after he was born, meaning he was brought up in an orphanage and also with foster parents. While in the orphanage [He was a "Coram Boy" , which will mean something to some of our readers—Ed] he learnt to play musical instruments, and joined the Argyll & Sutherland Highlanders as a 14 year-old boy soldier, playing the cornet in one of their bands.

The 1939/45 War saw his life change forever as the Argyll & Sutherland Highlanders were sent to defend Singapore when the Japanese threatened. Things didn't go well and David was captured, having a terrible time in POW Camps including spells on the death railway in Burma and at some time near the River Kwai. On demob he went to Scotland but failed to settle in a number of civilian jobs before joining the RAF in the mid-50s. He was happiest at RAF Duxford and was a member of the RAF Duxford Association until his death aged 96. He was at RAF Coltishall in the late 60s before being posted to Akroti - then returning to RAF Coltishall as a Sergeant Armourer.

He'd excelled at racing cycling & swimming, not taking up running until aged 47, then going on to complete 32 marathons, including the first London in 1981. He took up horse riding, shooting and fencing as he wanted to do well at the Modern Pentathlon, and was in an RAF Coltishall trio which won the Inter-Station Modern Pentathlon in the late 60s. His diary showed he completed 63,000 miles running in both training and racing. One year his swimming distance exceeded 90 miles. Dave was tough!

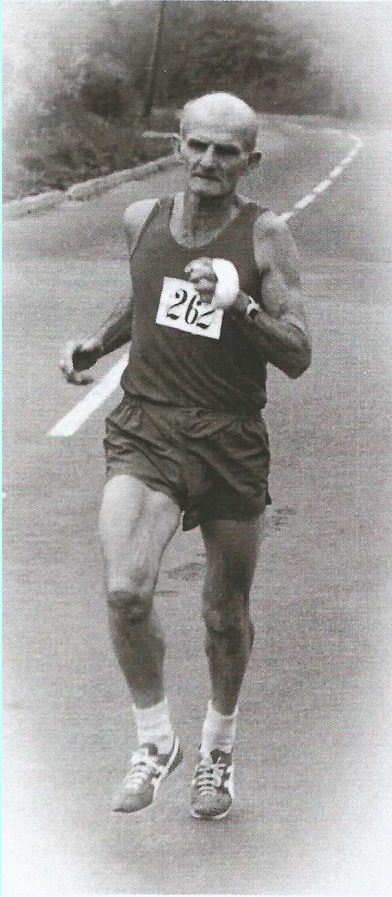
He belonged to Cambridge & Coleridge AC and also Eastern Vets and was President for Life of the Eastern Cross Country League. When aged 95 Dave bought his first ever TV set and mobile phone!

Speakers at the Memorial Service were his nephew Michael Ashfield (on behalf of the family), John Caldicott (on behalf of The Old Coram Association), and David Kennett (on behalf of the Armed Forces.). Mr. Caldicott recalled that last year The Old Coram Association held a reception in the Houses of Parliament, where Dave - aged 95 - had given a wonderful speech.

Despite bad experiences in Singapore, Dave was posted back there in his RAF career, but he didn't complain, as Dave never complained about anything! He'd married the daughter of a Foster Parent, but it ended early and sadly as his wife suffered a fatal brain clot - Dave was never to marry again.

This Memorial Service ended with Pipe Major Sloan (in full traditional Scottish attire) of the 1st Battalion

Black Watch playing "Flowers Of The Forest". How does one get a Scots piper to come so far from where his Regiment is based? Easy - he's seconded on Recruitment Office Duties in Cambridge City Centre and was close by. I'm glad I went as it was so uplifting to hear so much about a truly lovely man who is so easy to remember. Indeed it was mentioned he was Captain of RAF Coltishall's cross-country team in the late 60s.



A former RAF race walker from the 60s/70s, octogenarian (and ex-Hon. EVAC Newsletter Editor) Chief Technician Tony Challis, who now resides in a Care Home in the next street to this church, attended David's memorial service with his wife Barbara.

***Tony penned and sent in his own thoughts on David:***

***David Blyth. 1919 -2016***

***On 27 June my wife and I attended the Celebration Service at Saint Andrews Church, Chesterton, following David's committal at Cambridge Crematorium. The service took the form of stories about his life and his time in an orphanage to his last days. These were given by friends who knew about his Army Service and his time in the RAF as well as his running career. There were a good number of people present, but I would have liked to have seen a few more from EVAC and Cambridge runners.***

***I had known Dave a good number of years and had interviewed him for the EVAC mag\*\*, but I didn't know he was brought up in an orphanage or that he was once married.***

***The Service concluded with the Pipe Major of the 1st Battalion of the Black Watch playing 'Flowers of the Forest', a very emotional feeling.***

## Membership Secretary's Updates:

### Important news first:

Because of other commitments, I will be stepping down as MemSec from 1<sup>st</sup> January 2017. This is to give the new MemSec an opportunity to get to know the ropes in time for the membership renewals nearer to 1<sup>st</sup> April (new membership season). During January and February some members start to renew so some hands-on familiarisation will be available.

Although I will be on hand to give guidance to whoever takes over, in the unlikely event that no one wishes to take on the role, I will **NOT** continue as MemSec. Peter Kennedy (BMAF IT Mgr) will also be available with any technical support required.

### What does it entail?

With the introduction of on-line registration and renewal (through BMAF OpenTrack) most of the work is done electronically. The new or renewing member undertakes the bulk of the initial work: personal details, interests, club details, EA details and BMAF details. If all this data is in order (member's responsibility) the MemSec's role is to validate their data and change their account from 'Pending' to 'Confirmed'. Payment can be made on-line using Stripe (similar to PayPal) or they can pay via Inter-bank transfer or by good old fashioned cheque.

Although it is not essential, some understanding of Excel will help. I use Excel mainly to create management reports for interested parties, for example, Race Directors, who may want a list of members and their paid up status! OpenTrack has its own set of reports which are available to approved individuals.

## **A bit about BMAF OpenTrack (extracted from a memo written by Peter Kennedy to MemSecs)**

We are now coming up to 6 months since Reportlab won a contract for the development of grassroots athletics technology and open data in the UK and across Europe from the European Community FINODEX project. They are now trying to win a second tranche of funding.

We made a decision last November to give up on England Athletics providing something we could use. Instead, we persuaded Reportlab to take us on as a major customer at short notice, based on their FINODEX funding from the European Community and what we pay them in commission on the online payments. This doesn't go anywhere near covering the costs of all the development work we would like to have; nevertheless, we managed to get a replacement system into action in time to handle the entries for all the indoor championships and the large number of membership renewals that come in January. We achieved this in part by accepting a less polished system initially, with some functionality missing. Much of the latter is covered by manual efforts by Alex Rowe and myself and extra work by yourselves [MemSecs]. We are still expecting them to extend the membership renewal and competition entry processes, as well as effecting a long list of other big and small changes.

### **UKA Registration Checks**

UKA introduced the following rules in April 2016 :

- Any affiliated Club accepting a Second Claim or "First Claim other" member as a competing athlete must satisfy itself that the athlete is already registered with his/her National Association.
- All competitions under the rules of UKA and Domestic Competitions held under IAAF Rules are confined to eligible athletes as defined by these rules. All athletes in Age Groups covered by these Rules (Age Group Under 13 upwards) must be registered with their National Association and comply with their terms and conditions including payment.
- Athletes will be disqualified when competing in events with a UKA permit if they are not currently registered to a National Association. Registration is not mandatory for any non-competing members and overseas-resident guest competitors in these events

These rules do not apply to those competing solely in road/fell/trail individual races, but they already had the obligation to pay a £2 supplement if unattached or a member of a registered club but not registered with their National Association, and this rule will now be more strictly enforced by race promoters.

The BMAF area clubs will shortly enforce these rules as follows:

- A new member without a first claim club must start the process of choosing a first claim club and obtaining UKA registration if they are intending to compete in BMAF national or area club cross-country or track and field events with UKA permits. They will need to maintain this registration on annual basis for as long as they are competing. UKA registration is done via EA, WA, SA or ANI depending which national athletics association their first claim club is registered with.
- Online entry to BMAF national or area club cross-country, track & field, or race walking competitions with a UKA permit will be blocked unless the athlete is logged as UKA registered in the Opentrack database. Registration information for EA and WA registered athletes comes in real time from the EA database. SA and ANI are providing us with a list of their registered athletes each month but we can update this information for any athlete who sends us evidence that they have recently registered.
- You will be able to see your UKA registration status in Section E of your personal data in OpenTrack, updated to the latest information received, and if the status is Red or Amber you may need to take action before you can enter the competition of your choice.

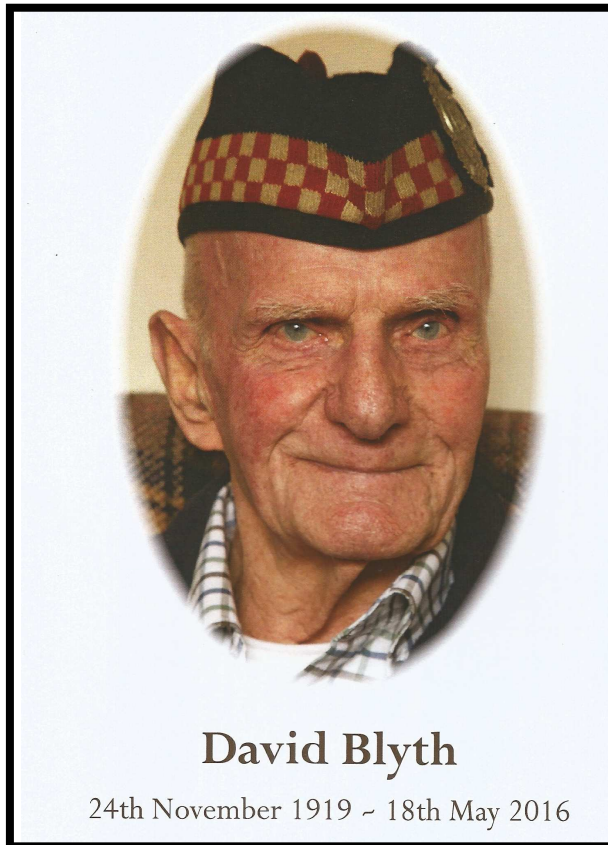
