The AGM was poorly attended. This was probably as expected, and the situation wouldn't really have been much different had any of the other ideas for dates and venues for holding it been followed up. Historically, if it has been held in conjunction with an event (T&F Final, Road Relays) only those concerned with that event have attended; the number of members sending apologies and therefore indicating any interest in the fact that the meeting was taking place was also minimal.

The fact that the meeting was technically inquorate, as noted by the Secretary in his email to all members recording the decisions taken at the meeting, would also probably have gone unnoticed by all bar a few. The club cannot make any progress if those doing all the admin work wait until enough people are interested in attending meetings and so, reluctantly, those few people doing the jobs feel forced into the unsatisfactory but necessary position of taking and acting on decisions in a context which is outside that specified in the club constitution.

After the meeting, when notes were circulated, there was only one message of abject dissent received regarding the decision to go ahead with changing the name of the club to Eastern Masters AC, in line with the views expressed by a considerable majority of those who responded to the Secretary's Round Robin poll prior to the meeting. However, no one has taken up the opportunity to call an EGM to oppose the decisions made at the meeting, express a lack of confidence in the current Officers and Committee and take over the running of the club themselves. The "excuse" that everyone gives that they are already busy committed to others clubs, organisations, family, work etc applies equally to those who are trying to keep the club running.

The time is right to effect the change, in financial terms, as new kit and medals are urgently needed and it makes sense to go ahead with the new name and designs rather than stockpiling any more of the old. The alternative, it seems, is stagnation. [Ed]

DON'T BE AN APRIL FOOL

1st April = 'R' day!

On the 1st of April EVAC membership renewal is due. There are now only two categories of membership :

- Ordinary 1st Claim – Ord_1C (where EVAC renews your EA Licence)
- Ordinary 2nd Claim – Ord_2C (where your local club renews your EA Licence for you).

Former Life Members will need to renew their membership as either Ord_1C or Ord_2C.

The costs of renewal are either: Ord_1C = £24 or Ord_2C = £12

Renewal could not be easier now we are using BMAF OpenTrack as our Membership database. Incidentally, all eleven regional clubs affiliated to BMAF are using the OpenTrack database. You just go to bmaf.org.uk and enter via [>MEMBER LOGIN](#) using your own email address and supplied (or changed) password. If you are yet to visit your account you will need to apply for a password – which will be sent to you almost immediately. This is achieved by clicking on **'First-time users please check your access'**. Follow the instructions and link that is sent to you – remember to change the supplied password to one of your own choice.

Unfortunately, if you fail to register by 1st April your account status will automatically change to **'Lapsed'** and can only be reset to **'Confirmed'** upon receipt of the necessary payment. Further, you will not be able to enter BMAF competition (via OpenTrack) as an EVAC member (only as a Guest at an increased entry fee), the EVAC Track & Field League, or any of the EVAC Championships. Finally, anyone considered "Lapsed" will receive one more reminder together with the next eNews. Access to the EVAC Facebook account would be restricted to reading the various comments without the ability to post on it.

Those members who failed to renew their membership in 2014-15 and 2015-16 will have found their account status listed as **'Archived'**. They would not have been able to order their hard copy of *Masters Athletics* or be able to read the on-line version. Only a renewal will change this status.

For those members who failed to renew for season 2015-16, their account status will switch from **'Lapsed'** to **'Archived'** until payment is received. They also will not be able to enter BMAF or EVAC competition as well as this being the last eNews they will receive. Restrictions to the use of the Facebook page and BMAF newsletter apply as above. The benefits of registering with EVAC are extensive: as well as Regional, National, European and World competition, in Road, Cross Country and Track & Field, you receive regular newsletters straight to your e-mail in-basket, together with any other notifications from both EVAC and BMAF. You will have write access to the EVAC group within Facebook. You will be able to order your personal hard copy of *Masters Athletics* or be able to read the online version and order club kit.

Those members who have used BMAF OpenTrack to make their payment may have noticed that their account status changed to "Pending". At the same time they would probably have noticed that they were not able to enter any competitions. This is a known glitch in the software and will be fixed at the next release. In the meantime, once I access your account, confirm your payment and change the status to **'Confirmed'** the ability to enter competition is reinstated. May I also remind members that as from 1st April it is a mandatory requirement to be a licensed member of England Athletics (EA). Although UKA has allowed a grace period until 1st July you may find it impossible to enter competition unless you are paid up. You may find, however, it is possible to enter Open competition as a Guest. League competition will be less tolerant.

ON THE ROAD AGAIN.....

Congratulations to PETE JOHNSON of Ryston Runners AC for winning last year's EVAC Road Race series title, with a massive 86.1% average AG score.

Stephen Thompson (Kettering Town Harriers) was second with 79.6% and in third place Phil Martin of Bushfield Joggers had an aggregate score of 78.3%. Twelve members completed the minimum number of races to qualify for consideration in the results, with a further 57 completing at least one of the nominated events.

Despite the ongoing lack of a Road Secretary at the time of publishing, EVAC Secretary Maurice Hemingway has set in place a four race Road Running Series for 2016. The featured events are :

We battled for 3rd place over the last four miles, running neck and neck, but with 200 metres to go, I went for it and finished just 3 seconds ahead of him to take 3rd place."

INTER-AREA MATCH — INDOOR TRACK AND FIELD — LEE VALLEY — 28 FEB 2016



Pictured above are some of our victorious women's team from the 2016 Inter-Area indoor match. It was a very exciting day, and what with calls-offs due to injury, illness, etc, and almost unbelievable result.

Team Managers Gaye Clarke and Joe McGrath had their work cut out covering events and juggling athletes (Cirque de Soleil calling?!) but team spirit was never in doubt, and probably helped by the call of the box of M&Ms on the team table.

In the end it was even closer than it seemed on the day as, after results had been checked and altered, EVAC Women's team beat SCVAC by a mere 5 points (246.5 to 241.5). EVAC men were 4th in their match (SCVAC 301, VAC 254, MMAC 233, EVAC 215.5) and when their scores were combined EVAC came out second overall with 462 to SCVAC's 542.5.

On paper we have some of the strongest athletes in the country and are well placed to take these inter-area challenges by the horns. The tricky bit is having all the highest achieving athletes fit and available on the right days. Already we know of several who are unavailable for the next Inter-Area Challenge, which is at Solihull on 17th July.

Tanya Daniels has agreed to be women's TM in advance of the match, with **Christine Anthony and Monica Brown** hands-on on the day as Tanya is not able to be there herself.

Andrew Stowe and Richard Phelan will be coordinating teams for the men.

BATH TIME

On the same weekend as the BMAF Indoor T&F Championships at Lee Valley, the BMAF Cross Country Championships were held at Bath.

While some made the choice between events, there was at least one who managed to fit in both — Christine Anthony came to Lee Valley via Cofton Park, where she watched her youngest son running in the Inter-Counties XC Champs, bagged herself a bronze and a 6 second PB in the W50 1500m, went back to Suffolk overnight, picked up team-mate Maureen McCarthy, and drove to Bath to compete on Sunday.



It paid off, as Maureen (left) and Christine (right) sewed up the W50 championship with a 1-2, Gold to Maureen and Silver to Christine on this occasion.

Another Christine - this time Christine Lathwell - took gold in the W35 and Mary Holmes did likewise in the W75 age group.

Yuko Gordon finished in bronze medal position in the W65 category after a tough battle with Ros Tabor.

Sole EVAC medallist in the Men's events was Alan Daghish, with a silver in the M65 race, while Mick Bridgeland was just edged out into 4th in the M55s.

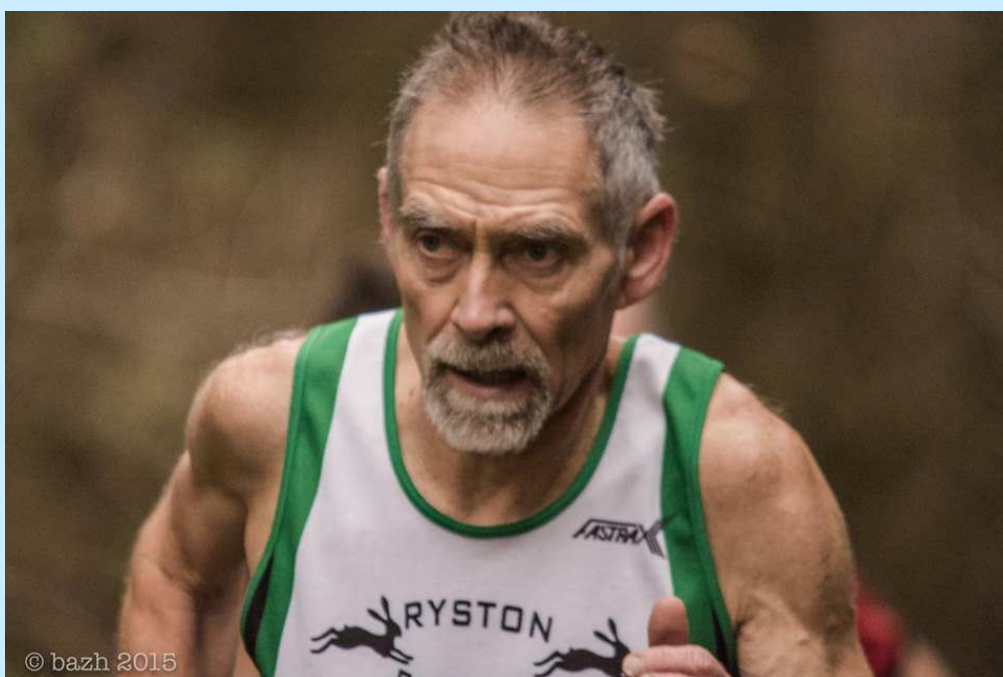
